

Context of Project CISE-ALERT

■ What is CISE?

The Common Information Sharing Environment - CISE is a network that connects systems of authorities with responsibility in maritime surveillance. CISE enables them to exchange relevant information across borders and different sectors, allowing for more effective operations at sea.

In the context of CISE, project CISE-ALERT will act as a catalyzer to test past, ongoing, and short-term activities and developments on CISE with one ambition – to push-up CISE from the current transitional phase to its operational state.



Project CISE-ALERT at a glance




Main characteristics

CISE-ALERT will:



- Test the pre-operational services developed during the Transitional phase of CISE;
- Implement and test new operational services;
- Enlarge the CISE network;
- Introduce an actually shared first dataset package;
- Gather a first core community of CISE users (services and authorities).
